## 4. Treasurer Report:

#### 6. Firewise Update:

34 Neighborhoods in Good Standing – 3 Pending (in application process) – 2 in the wings. Participated in the quarterly Regional Coordinators meeting this month, will be sharing updates received from the meeting. Mostly it was regarding the recertification process, but it also highlighted the issues people have been dealing with regarding insurance discounts for being a FW community. It was stressed, heavily, that Firewise was never intended, nor created, for this purpose. It's to create a coordinated effort throughout your immediate community to educate and be proactive in preparation for potential wildfire and mitigating the threat of wildfire. Will be having a virtual Firewise Forum on Friday, October 4<sup>th</sup>. Notices have been posted and sent as of today. We have had 6 FW neighborhoods coordinate chipping events.

**CAL FIRE:** Still fire season. D-Space have been in Amador Pines for inspections. Real Estate inspections are about a month out. Subdivision Review project is underway. Here to help with CWPP. Conflicting messages given regarding insurance discounts....
