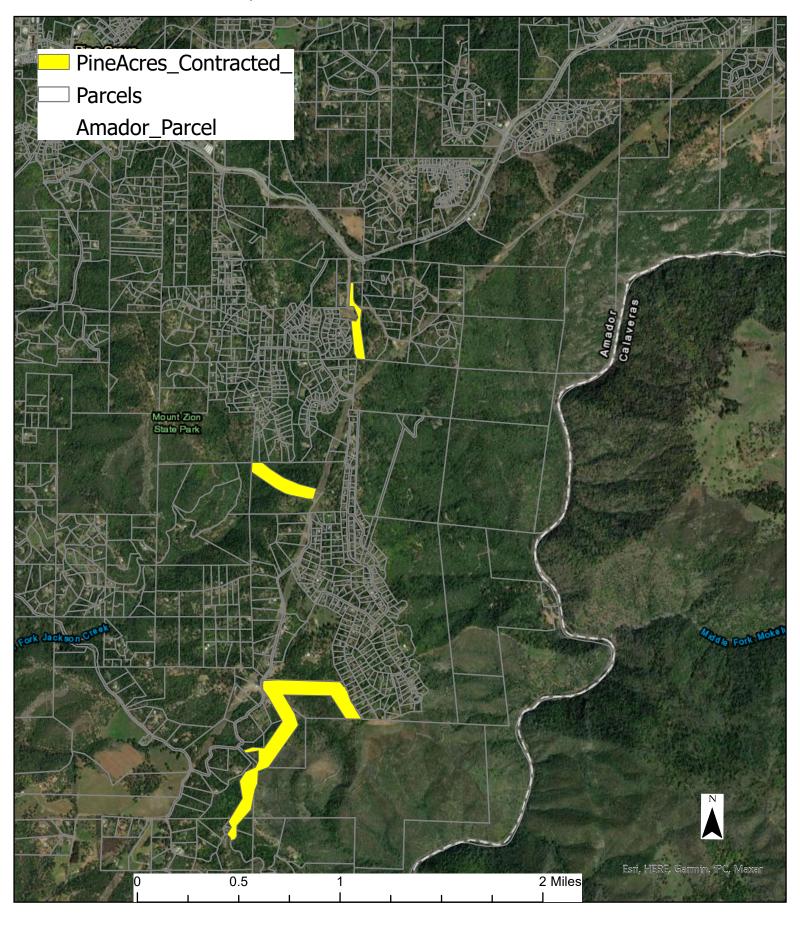
CalFire Evacuation Planning Grant	This grant ends on March 15th, 2024, staff will be working on closing out this project and final reporting. Due to several issues, the grant deliverables had to be adjusted. The AFSC will be treating/maintaining an estimated 82 acres of the Pine Acres Fuel Break with these funds. 19 acres of road have been treated. Signage will be provided to 16 FireWise Communities. Standardized road name signs for private roads will be provided to FWC which completed the survey/order form. These road name signs will be installed by the community, all materials will be provided. The lack of highly visible road name signs on private roads was a top concern for emergency responders.	Final reporting will be completed and signage will be distributed. 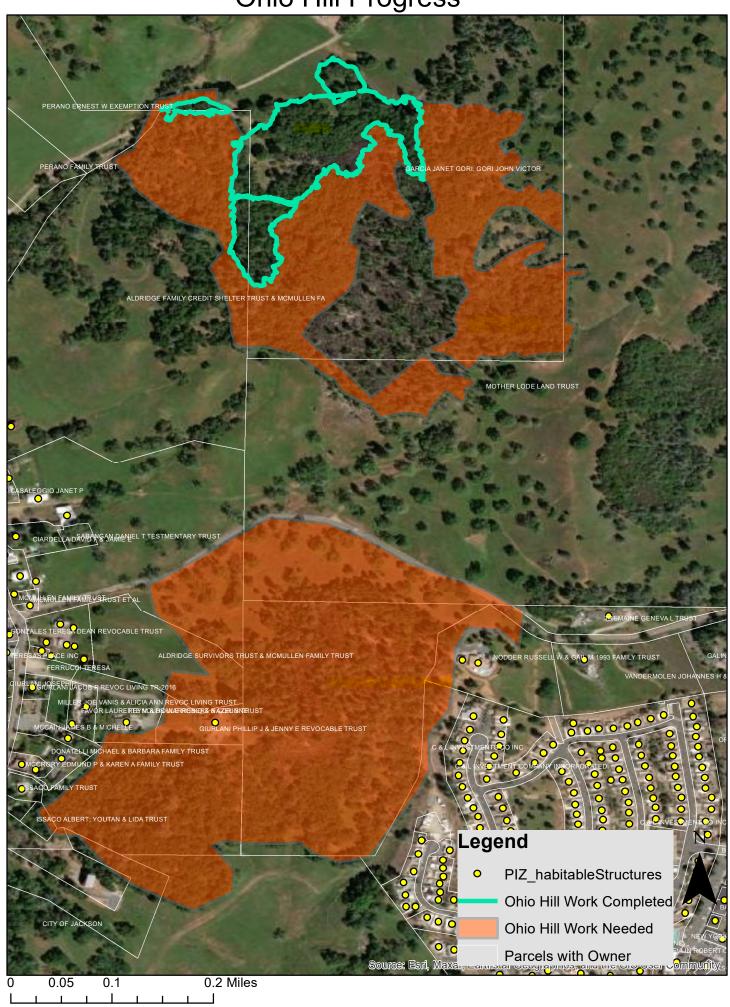

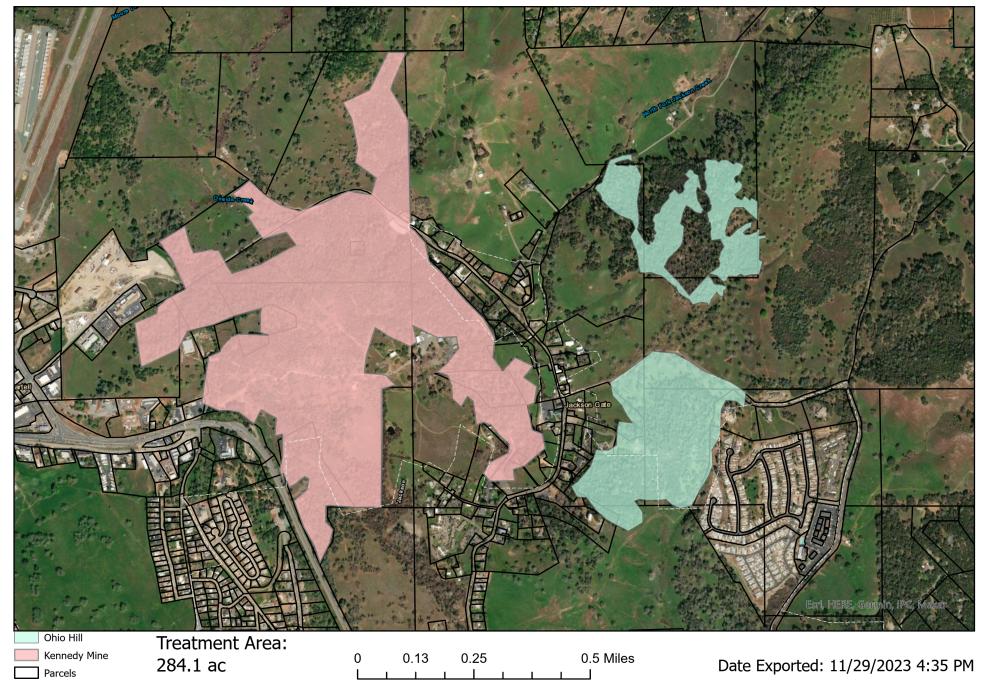
Pine Acres Maintenance Fuelbreak Up to 82 Acres of fuelbreak treatment

Regional Forest and Fire Capacity Program (RFFCP) Round 3 funding

Sierra Nevada Conservancy (SNC) invited AFSC to the Regional Forest and Fire Capacity Program (RFFCP) Round 3 funding in the areas of capacity building and/or project development. The Sierra Nevada Conservancy (SNC) received RFFCP funding as a block grant from the Department of Conservation. The specific **goals** the SNC is trying to achieve with the funding are to:

- Advance capacity throughout the SNC Region to scale up forest and fire project planning and implementation to maximize the real impact on healthy forests and community resilience.
- Establish robust project pipelines in each Planning Area to support the stability of the
- implementing organizations/agencies and further the pace of restoration and protection work.

The AFSC conducted an internal needs assessment and met with SNC to develop a work plan and budget, budget is the result of these efforts. AFSC will complete the final proposal and will submit it before February 26th.
