CWPP

A Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP) is a locally developed planning document, authorized under the Healthy Forests Restoration Act of 2003, that identifies and prioritizes actions to reduce wildfire risk to communities and surrounding landscapes. CWPPs are prepared collaboratively with input from local governments, fire agencies, land management agencies, and stakeholders to assess wildfire hazards, guide fuels reduction, and improve preparedness.

Benefits of a CWPP include enhanced public safety through prioritized fuels management, improved coordination among agencies and landowners, increased eligibility for state and federal funding, and greater community resilience by reducing wildfire intensity, protecting critical infrastructure, and supporting fire-adapted ecosystems.

The Amador Fire Safe Council (AFSC) is developing the Amador County CWPP in partnership with Spatial Informatics Group (SIG) and input from stakeholders across the county. You can follow progress on the geospatial wildfire risk and hazard analysis by viewing the [Amador County CWPP Map Viewer](#).
