AW presented notes from last Projects Committee meeting. Discussed Strategic Plan recommendations. CD added insight on ingress/egress and fuel break design for evacuation safety. AW reviewed map that will be released publicly as part of CWPP.

a. Review Draft AFSC Partnership Contract* - Past AFSC/AFP agreement was one year; new agreement will be broad with exhibits. Current exhibit: \$10,000 for Firewise assistance. AFPD requested to provide updates at Board meetings (Zoom acceptable).

SP motioned to approve with added note about AFPD updates; CG seconded; all in favor.

b. CWPP Update - TB provided background on outdated CWPP, process for new CWPP, and progress update. Community Participation Survey is open; public encouraged to respond.

- Cal Fire (Jeff Hoag): Working on CWPP with all groups; met with PG&E on distribution line identification; Defensible Space inspections up; final report expected Jan/Feb 2026.

- Amador Fire Protection District: No update.

Amador County Fire Resiliency Project – New Project	Treatment on BLM/nearby properties treatment, connect to fuel breaks and estimated 230 acres will be treated. Staff and AFSC Projects Committee is working to prioritize treatment areas and projects.
Tiger Creek/Crestview Forest Health	Project is completed; staff is working on closeout documentation and final report.
AmCo Stewardship Forest Health	Received BLM DNA and Decision Record for three parcels to be treated near Buckhorn Ridge unit. Reports cover 61 acres. Awaiting approval from Liz Lucas and Amador Co. Supervisor Jeff Brown to work on BLM land around Pioneer Park (County recreation lease). Expect full County support. Waiting on approval from SNC to move forward with implementation.
River Pines Fuel Break Butte Mtn Fuels Reduction Rendic Fuel Break NOE	<p>Butte Mtn: Mastication by Krisman Enterprises started December 17, 2025. Approximately 4–5 days of work by crew through the end of the year, impacted by numerous days of inclement weather and poor soil conditions. Work being conducted on both sides of Clinton Road.</p> <p>Rendic: Cultural survey on 187-acre CEQA footprint conducted December 16, 2025 by three staff members of Environmental Resource Compliance (ERC). No funding for implementation. This cultural survey was accomplished with remaining money in the 5GG21201 grant. Having this in place allows AFSC to submit a funding application with one CEQA component completed. CalFire has not been enthusiastic about this project; consider submitting to SNC for funding.</p>
Volcano Hills Fuel Break	AFSC projects committee selected two contracts for this work. This project is deemed high visibility with many private property owners the AFSC Committee selected two contracts that will meet the implementations of this project and have extensive experience working on projects that involve a high level of public interaction. Contracts with Krisman and Tanner have been signed and it is anticipated work will start ASAP, depended on weather.
Upper Jackson Gate Fuel Break	Project is completed. Project close-out and final report has been submitted to PG&E.
Community Wildfire Protection Plan	<p>The Working Group Meeting and Steering Committee are holding monthly meetings. 57 public participants in five town halls (Nov); ~50 online survey responses. SIG completed wildfire risk/hazard modeling; view layer “EwNVC Amador CWPP” on web map. Treatment data gathered from AFSC, ARCD, CALTRANS, PG&E, East Bay MUD; El Dorado NF/SPI data in progress.</p> <p>Next steps: identify priority focus areas in Vibrant Planet/Planscape; develop Action Plan and Priority Projects. Steering Committee leading drafting; Working Group input.</p> <p>CWPP on track for April 2026 completion. Progress posted on AFSC website with SIG web map.</p> <p>The CWPP website is live and includes information about how to participate in the process, view mapping, and review meeting information.
